



Floater – Job Description

Job Summary: Floaters are responsible for helping to facilitate the early education of children in their care. Duties include supporting other staff members throughout the program to ensure students are appropriately supervised. Floaters must be flexible and willing to work with various classes of multiple ages.

Key Responsibilities include:

- Enforce rules of behavior as well as routines for students
- Implement activities, tools, and resources for students to use and explore during learning and play activities as directed by lead teacher
- Adapt teaching methods and materials to meet the interests, age, and learning styles of students
- Develop and maintain positive relationships with children and parents
- Maintain clean and tidy facilities
- Help students reach developmental milestones
- Believe and teach the 6 Fundamental Truths of Bible curriculum
- Encourage student development of social skills in accordance with objectives
- Provide appropriate supervision for children at all times
- Maintain inventory system for resources, materials, and supplies
- Adhere to health, safety, security, and sanitation procedures
- Participate in school events with students
- Communicate with families regarding student performance and behavior
- Participate in professional development opportunities
- Perform other relevant tasks as assigned

- Must be able and willing to submit to and pass a standard background check
- Certified in First Aid/CPR/AED Child & Adult (or willing to obtain certification)
